Monday, January 20, 2020 - Australian wildfires and Iranian plane crash

The ongoing Australian wildfires and the shocking plane crash in Iran remind us of how both nature and human decisions can cause such immense suffering. Our Dress Down Day this Thursday is in support of Australian relief efforts.

Let us pray. + Lord, we ask that you be with all those who have experienced such unbelievable loss in Australia and Iran. Bless the souls of those who have perished and bring consolation to those who are left behind. Help those, including many Canadians, who are fighting the fires and bless Australia with more rain and the protection of homes and wildlife. May there be truth and justice for those on the Iranian plane and may the investigation into what exactly happened motivate leaders to work toward peace. May we all respect the power of nature and recognize the importance of our own decisions in helping to make the world a better place. We ask this through the prayers of Your Mother: *Hail Mary.* + Amen.

Friday, January 24, 2020 - first day of High School exams

St. Paul wrote, "Do not worry about anything, but in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known to God. And the peace of God, which surpasses all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus." Worry is not from God and misdirects our energy away from what we can control. Accepting that our best is all that God expects of us can put us in the mental space to actually achieve our best.
